Huddersfield Giants coached KS1 pupils to develop the pupils game playing skills and also provided CPD for the staff Sporting events celebrated in school in a dedicated page on the half termly Celebration Newsletter. CPD for NQT's and less confident staff had a positive impact on their confidence and motivation to teach PE

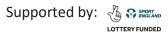
